WAYS TO GET INVOLVED

If you weren't able to make it to the First Grants Committee Meeting on September 5th, email us to get on the list to get involved! There are four areas for member involvement:

DIG - Discovery, Inquiry and Guidelines: this newly formed group will be looking at the focus area for next year, the Environment. The group's activities will occur in "clusters" from fall through spring, but will not be constant throughout the year. Watch your email for more information about DIG. DIG members need at least one year experience on one of the following: Discovery Team, Proposal Review or Site Visits.

Proposal Review: this team reads and scores the actual Health and Human Services grant proposals and decides which ones will go on to the next step of site visits. No experience required.

Training: January 8

Dates: Jan. 9 - 30 & Feb. 5

Team Leaders: Alexis Lasheras & Catalina Preskill

Site Visits: these members go out and visit the organizations that are seeking grants. They make recommendations to the full grants committee (all members who have participated in one of these committees this year) for inclusion on the final ballot. No experience required.

Consider Corporate Gift Matching

Many companies have programs through which they will "match" the charitable contributions made by their employees. Through corporate gift matching, your employer can multiply your gift to SDWF, making it go even further. Check your company's Human Resources office to see if they offer gift matching. (If they don't, you may want to ask your company to start one.) If your employer does offer this program, your Human Resources department should provide you with a matching gift form to send to SDWF along with your donation. Conditions and criteria for gift matching vary by employer. Some companies offer a payroll deduction plan.
